

Research and Innovation for Global Health Transformation (RIGHT) - Call 7

Research funding to develop interventions for the early detection and management of metabolic risk factors for CVD and stroke in primary and community care settings.

- Scope:
 - Cardiovascular diseases (CVD). Metabolic risk factors in scope include:
 - Hypertension
 - Overweight/obesity
 - Hyperglycemia
 - Hyperlipidaemia
- Awards: £1 5m per Project, for 3-5 years

NIHR Global Research Professorship Round 7

Career development award to fund leaders to promote research translation. Scope:

- Early translational (experimental medicine),
- clinical and applied health research,
- and social care research (not basic research)
- Awards: On average £1.7 1.8m per award, for 5 years

- Support postdoctoral researchers to conduct a research project in a strategic area of applied global health and receive a bespoke training and development programme relevant to their needs



 Strengthen institutional capacity for research in LMICs





Key information

Postgraduate fellowship: All career stages and all professions

Interested applicants should submit an expression of interest form via the NIHR website

Up to 10 NIHR Global Advanced Fellowships available in the first round, increasing in future rounds

Express an interest in becoming a funding committee member

Application window: 16 April - 11 July 2024

No limit to the number of applications that can be submitted per institution. However, we do not expect to fund more than two awards per host institution per round







Product development research for global health

- Scope: Research and development of new products to improve health outcomes for the poorest and most vulnerable in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs).
- Target: 1) build health security for all, 2) support healthier and more resilient populations, 3)help end
 the preventable deaths of mothers, babies and children
- Current priorities
 - women and girls health
 - infectious diseases of poverty
 - emerging infectious diseases/diseases of epidemic potential
- Eligibility: Lead organisations must be non-profit organisations.
- Open call until 23 February 2024

Reversing Environmental Degradation in Africa and Asia

- Scope: Research, innovation and action to help people and nature thrive together.
- Past call's themes:
 - 1. Local research and capability for research
 - 2. Resource and land use assessments

 - 4. Financing mechanisms
 - 5. Inclusive governance systems.
- Geographical focus: Sub-Saharan Africa, South Asia or Southeast Asia.
- Eligibility: Lead organisations must be non-profit organisations.
- Next call open: Around June 2024.

Global Centre on Biodiversity for Climate

- Scope: How the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity can help address climate change and improve livelihoods of the poor.
- Geographical focus: ODA-eligible countries in Latin America and the Caribbean, sub-Saharan Africa, and South East Asia and the Pacific.
- Eligibility: Lead applicants must not be for-profit-organisations.
- Next call open: Around May 2024.

12 September 2023 Applications open

7 November 2023 Applications close

November 2023 Initial application sift

January/February 2024 Applicants are shortlisted for interview

February to April 2024 Interview period

June/July 2024 Announcement of interview results

September/October 2024 Successful applicants arrive in the UK!

Apply for UK Research Funding Opportunities



Tips to apply for funding





Funding agencies and programmes

UK and Thailand has different research and funding landscape, and requirements.

- Objectives and priority areas
- Application processes
- Reviewing and scoring mechanism
- Supporting documents required
- Other terms and conditions



Get your proposals right

It is important that your proposal realistically responds and reflects what the programme is looking for.

- Consider audience of your proposal
- Official Development Assistance (ODA)
- Being realistic
- Learn from others



Know your institution

Different institutions (both UK and Thais) have different processes to apply for external funding.

- Explore internal review board
- It is not always about submitting as soon as possible.
- Identify the process to request for approval, and work backward on your own timeline.
- Alumni network



Find your partner

Researchers typically do not work alone – Make sure the right partner counts.

- Build your network early Consider business and networking platforms, joining workshops and conference (and make sure the networking counts)
- Representation and disciplines in your proposal
- Make sure your partners are equally eligible to apply
- Discuss legal implications early.
